The Steel Magnolias Breast Cancer Support Group Inc. met on Tuesday, January 26th in the private dining room of RMC.

The meeting was called to order by President Elaine Johns. We had 3 visitors, Lagina Fillingim, Faye Roberts and Pam Pinkard, which were welcomed to our meeting by Nancy Burnell.

Nancy Burnell gave the blessing before our meal of baked potatoes provided by RMC. Side dishes and desserts were provided by Steel Magnolias members.

Nancy Burnell introduced our guest speakers Kristin Reimer and Pat Yates from Knitted Knockers. Kristin and Pat belong to the Oxford Library and First United Methodist Church of Anniston knitting groups which knit special soft/ light weight breast prosthetics that are very comfortable for women who have undergone mastectomies, lumpectomies and radiation and/or are undergoing reconstruction. Kristin brought samples of the knitted knockers which are a comfortable and affordable alternative to traditional prosthesis that can be worn with your regular bra. Pat stated that their group would be more than happy to knit knockers at your request.

Margaret Taylor introduced our next guest, Lagina Fillingim, RMC Foundation Director. Lagina wanted to thank Steel Magnolias for our donation of \$5,000 to the new Cancer Center that is being built and stated that our organization gave the first large donation to support the Cancer Center. She also stated that the Community Outreach Employees want to be a part of anything that the Steel Magnolias do and are willing to help us with future projects. My Survivor Story

Hi, my name is Teresa L. Coleman. I am 53 years old. I live in Cedartown, GA. I have 3 kids ages 20, 18 and 15. I am a widow. My husband passed away 04/06/2010, he had Non Hodgins Lymphoma and Leukemia. He liked one month living 5 years after he found out he had cancer. During that time I found out I had stage 2/3 breast cancer, Invasive Ductal and Lobular cancer. I had 1 lymph node with metastatic carcinoma all on my right side. This all started 6/23/09. I had a biopsy and an ultra sound guided needle core biopsy. I then had a lumpectomy on my right breast, a Medi-port was put in place and I started Chemo on August 8th.

I started Radiation on January 19th 2010 and finished March 8th 2010 after 30 treatments. I then had a complete Hysterectomy on the 29th of March. I started Arimidex pill for 5 years, but my cancer is so aggressive they left me on the pill for now. I sure am glad, even though I hurt badly in my joints that I am still on the pill. Well after my hysterectomy my stomach got infected for some reason. I had cellulites. My Doctor wanted me back in the hospital that day, but I couldn't because my husband had passed away. I had to wait until his funeral was over then went in the hospital. Well my stomach busted open then it was M.R.S.A. Staph infection, the worse one to have. I got well enough to come home, but my mama had to pack my stomach every day for a week or two. During this time my mama told my doctor "Teresa has a hernia growing". Sure enough I ended up with the mesh and all doubled lined. All this happened October the 4th 2010. During all this my husband had not mad a will. He had 4 other kids by his 2 ex-wives. I had to fight like crazy to become administrator over what he had. I sold the house and split the money with seven kids in all. Se me and my three children moved and bought a house up town.

I've had two or three scares when I found a knot in my right breast, which "Thank God" it turned out to an oil cyst both times. I have other health problems now, but buy the Grace of God I am still kicking. I was 46 when I found out I had cancer in June of 2009. I turned 47 that September. Now I am 53 and still raising my kids. I thank God for it all. Because God is good all the time. All the time God is good!

Thanks for letting me share some of my story with you all. If anybody would like to be pen pals to hear more of my story and me hear theirs that would be nice.
