All day Monday, I listened to weather reports concerning 34 tornadoes in the Oklahoma City area. A strong tornado touched down in Norman. Norman, Moore and Oklahoma City make up a tri-city. I think only the residents know where one ends and the other begins. I was relieved, the evening of the 10th, when Gerald called from a hotel in Arkansas. He said, "In my haste to get back home, I didn't listen to the weather reports." Upon arriving home, he was pleased that he had been spared tornado damage. However, soft ball size hail had gone through his carport, his car would have been ruined if it had been parked in the carport. His house roof, that was replaced last year, needs replacing again this year.

Gerald went on to say, the Miracle Apple Tree shows no damage. A few days ago, Gerald Emailed pictures of the Miracle Apple Tree. He said, "Lenora, it is a miracle that the apple tree, supported by shrubs that grow around it, every year, bears an abundance of fruit."



On the steelmagnoliasinc.org website, on the "What Now" page, we read these words: "There is an old apple tree in the back corner of my back yard. It's a MIRACLE TREE. You would have to see it to believe it is still alive, let alone put on apples every year. The entire front of the tree died and carpenter ants hollowed the trunk most of the way up from the ground to the smaller limbs. It's lifeblood comes from the back half with no trunk to hold it up. The hedge protecting it from the winds allows it to remain standing. I don't harvest the apples; I let the birds and critters eat them.
