Pivotal Life Events

Throughout our lives, each of us have events that shape how we think and ultimately who we are. Where we grew up, when and where we received our formal education, who we marry, and the number and gender of our children. There are other pivotal events that are not sought in life but events that none the less shape us, events that force us to focus only on life's true treasures!

Such a time for me was September 29, 1999, when my surgeon told me that I had breast cancer. Mastectomy surgery was scheduled for October 6, 1999. In the week before my surgery, my inner circle of friends and family were a source of strength when I felt no strength within myself. I have heard some people say that after a diagnosis of cancer they felt strong and confident, however that is not the normal response. A diagnosis of cancer forces us to face our own mortality and to pledge to never "major on minors" any more. This "Thought for the Day" is meant to recognize the wonderful people in our lives who deserve to be recognized as "Majors" in our lives. This is my story! Please take the time to give credit to whoever was Major when you became part of the cancer family.

When I couldn't reach my husband who was on his construction sight, I called Gudrun and she came immediately and stayed with me until Prentiss saw that I'd called and made his way home. Secondly, Sheila Webb, the day before my mastectomy, gave me a journal that I might record my walk through my journey with breast cancer.

Wednesday, October 6, Prentiss, Gregory, my sister Debby, who had come from Missouri to be with me and Van and Michelle, who had spent the night, dressed and we made our way to RMC, Anniston. Many friends, many who were members of Gladeview Baptist where we were members, lined the hallway to pray me into surgery. When my sister, Debby saw all the people, she said, "Lenora, I would like to have your friends and family sign your journal." These precious friends not only signed but wrote encouraging messages for me. In the years that have come and gone, the 19 years since my mastectomy, I have lost my precious Prentiss and been diagnosed with lung disease, etc. The loving thoughts my friends and family recorded in my journal have continued to be a source of strength for me.

I encourage everyone, please let those from whom you draw strength know what their generosity and love means to you.

Services Offered By Steel Magnolias Breast Cancer Support Group, Inc.

1. Group Meetings

Steel Magnolias meet on the 4th Tuesday of each month at 5:00 p.m. in the 1st Floor Private Dinning Room of RMC.

2. Steel Magnolias' Office

Our office is located in suite 407 of the Physicians Center in Anniston. Currently our office is staffed (part time) by Steel Magnolias volunteers Monday through Friday, 11:00 am - 4:00 pm. Every effort is made to have someone in the office when our staff is sick or on vacation. Phone (256) 231-8827

3. PINKS Boutique

Located in the Physicians' Center across from the Steel Magnolias Office, we are stocked with Mastectomy Bras, Breast Prosthesis, Wigs, Hats and Scarves. These items are of no cost to cancer patients.

4. Care Packages

Steel Magnolias provide a comfort package including inspirational and educational materials to breast cancer patients the day of surgery at Regional Medical Center. Packages are mailed or taken to newly diagnosed patients who do not receive them on day of surgery.

5. Dining Vouchers

Dining vouchers are provided for two family members of any patient, in surgery, at Regional Medical Center. Each provides a meal in the hospital cafeteria.

6. Snacks

Steel Magnolias provide the following: (1) snacks in Anniston Oncology chemo treatment room - Suite 602 Physician Center (2) chemo treatment room on the 4th floor of RMC and (3) the Radiation / Oncology Center on 2nd Floor of RMC.

7. Breast Cancer Awareness Program

Available to girls in grades 7-12, this program is taught in the school by a trained volunteer under the supervision of a Registered Nurse. Anyone interested in having our program presented, contact our office.

8. Speakers Bureau

Speakers are available to civic clubs and churches. To schedule, contact our office.

9. Steel Magnolias Newsletter

Our monthly newsletter is an informative and inspirational publication about upcoming events, meetings and activities. Also included is a joke page and current information regarding cancer testing and treatments.
