

From the Beginning

At the time of Steel Magnolias Breast Cancer Support Group's founding, we had no supporters, except for Chaplain Wilson and that was support of encouragement. I knew if we were going to get the attention of the people of the community and the attention of newly diagnosed patients, we had to have brochures, explaining who we were, what our mission was, how we could help newly diagnosed patients and where they could contact us. We had no financial supporters except me, the founder and I feared that Prentiss would soon learn how much money the newsletter was costing. I felt certain that God meant that this organization should have a newsletter. The cost of paper, printing, envelopes and postage was paid for by me, not to mention all the work associated with preparing the letter for mailing. I knew we had to have fundraisers but who would attend if we didn't have posters and flyers advertising the events? This is what led me to type-setter, Debra Moore.

I explained what I was doing, my lack of funds and asked if she would do some printing for our group until we could raise some money and then we could pay her? Debra's reply was, "I believe in what you are doing and want to help in whatever way I can!" Through the years, due largly to Debra's generosity, we gained financial support, partners and became a 501 c 3 non profit organization!

Many years later, after we moved into our office at Suite 406 of the RMC Physician's Center and established Pink's Boutique across the hall from our office, I made a special request of Debra. I asked her to design a special banner portraying a butterfly breaking free from it's cocoon. That is how we Steel Magnolias feel after being told we are cancer free. It so happened that the day the banner was delivered to our office, a young woman was in Pink's Boutique with her mother, helping her choose a wig and other needed items as she started her journey through her treatments. With the help of an office attendant, the banner was unfurled! The daughter said, "Oh look, Mama, Someday you will be like that beautiful butterfly, free from the cocoon of cancer!"



Recently, Debra's husband, Scott, created another banner to attract donors to a special fundraiser and dyed his hair and beard pink to encourage gifts of \$100 or more. Everyone asked why he was so passionate, going above and beyond? He said, honestly, I've



been to one of their banquets and it is a really important cause and the founder is important to our family.

Scott raised \$1600 for Steel Magnolias Breast Cancer Support Group, Inc. Debra and I are both very proud of Scott! Thank you!!!! On October 26th at 8:30 in the morning the Steel Magnolias set up their table at the Barn at Bennett's Flats with information to hand out to those participating in a kickboxing workout. This event/fundraiser was sponsored by Buster Miles Chevrolet and Ford. There was a \$10 entrance fee for the kickboxing and an opportunity to participate in a Mimosa bar and a Silent Auction. There were about 30-35 participants. We had a lot of fun "watching" and being able to talk to several about our work. Madelyn Miles told us that she wanted this to be an annual event and was looking forward to an even larger group next year!

B.R. Wilson was there with the Pink Firetruck and there were several that signed the truck for themselves or in memory or honor of someone.

Madelyn Miles presented a check for \$589 from this fundraiser. Thank you Madelyn and the Buster Miles Chevrolet/Ford for being so aware of the needs of women diagnosed with breast cancer.


